

GENERAL CONCLUSION

After listing some of the miracles of the Holy Quran (25 in this book), which constitute a tiny fraction of all the other miracles recounted in other works, one cannot help but make the following observations:

-Before the final compilation of the Holy Quran by the Prophet Muhammad himself...according to the logic of recently discovered miracles...or by his companions a hundred years later, according to his detractors, we had in our hands writings on dried cow hides of this nature:



This manuscript from the University of Birmingham, dated by carbon 14, dates back to the 7th century AD. We note that the surah is not numbered and that the verses are separated by grouped dots :: and not by numbers!

And here is the same passage from the printing presses of the 21st century:



Here we can clearly see the number of the surah, the number of verses, and the numbers separating them.

Comparing these two documents, one cannot help but conclude that all the mathematical miracles of the Holy Quran—which are related to numbers—could never have emerged from a book that had not yet been compiled at the beginning and lacked the numerical references necessary to calculate the nine formulas related in this work!

-For each miracle studied in this book, we have "estimated" downwards in most cases the probability P that this miracle could arise by chance, and we have obtained 25 numbers all close to ZERO!

The combined probability of these 25 miracles occurring and coming together in the same book will therefore be the product of the 25 numbers found...

Total probability = $P_1 \times P_2 \times P_3 \times \dots \times P_{25}$

Imagine the value we will obtain if we multiply 25 numbers all close to ZERO!

The immediate consequence of this work is that the Holy Quran emanates from a divine entity endowed with a superior intelligence beyond the reach of any

form of human intelligence until the Day of Resurrection.

What will the detractors of the Holy Quran think now? Didn't they claim in dozens of YouTube videos that the Holy Quran is a human work compiled after the death of the Prophet by his companions? And this after copying all the passages written on the skins of cows, sheep, and even on stones...?

What will Mohammad Ali Amir-Moezzi, his colleague Guillaume Dye, and their entire team of researchers think, having published the book **The Historians' Quran (Le Coran des historiens)**, in which they strive to prove that this holy book is a human work devoid of any divine intervention and subject to the historical events that marked the emergence and development of Islam?

Is their 3,400-page, three-volume work still plausible if it can be torpedoed forever by the 25 miracles recounted in this modest work?

Can it provide us with a rational explanation to justify the existence of all these miracles?

How could the Holy Quran have emerged from passages written and scattered here and there over a period of 100 years and compiled by many contributors who never consulted each other?

Who arranged the surahs and verses of the Holy Quran so that in the 21st century we could discover hundreds of miracles thanks to computer technology?

And for those who still doubt the divine origin of the Holy Quran, I challenge them with the following:

THE TEST OF THE GOLDEN NUMBER IN THE QURAN.

Here's how it works:

-Run the QURANMATH application on a PC.

-Click on File/New/Manual Mode.

-Try to calculate the values of the nine formulas that govern the classification of the surahs of the Holy Quran under the same conditions as in the time of the Prophet (pencil + paper + use of Roman numerals).

If you pass this test, it proves that a human being can achieve something as astonishing as the Holy Quran, and if, despite your best efforts, you fail, you must

acknowledge in your heart and conscience that the Holy Quran is **the only divine book** on planet Earth that has not been falsified!
